Auditor General for Wales' Audit Certificate and report

I report in respect of my audit of the accounts under section 13 of the Act, whether any matters that come to my attention give cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met. My audit has been conducted in accordance with guidance issued by the Auditor General for Wales.

Auditor General's report

Audit opinion – Qualified

Except for the matters reported below in my Basis for Qualification, on the basis of my review, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention giving cause for concern that in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

Basis for Qualification

Accounting Statement

In my opinion, the Accounting Statement does not fairly present the Council's income and expenditure and financial position for the year ended 31 March 2022:

- The debtors balance which consists entirely of the Council's VAT reclaimable amount is overstated by £622.05.
- The creditors balance has been disclosed as "£0" which contradicts the Council's own listing of payments that were yet to be paid but relate to the 21/22 financial year. Therefore, the Council's creditor balance is understated by £1538.20 and equally the Council's bank balance is understated by the same amount.

Annual Governance Statement

I am unable to conclude whether or not the Annual Governance Statement is consistent with the Council's governance arrangements:

- Assertion 3 – noncompliance with laws, regulations and codes of practice. The Council has made payments totalling £2400 to a single councillor that exceeds the maximum amount allowed by the Independent Remuneration Panel for Wales (IRPW).
- In my opinion, the excess payments made are unlawful.

Other matters arising and recommendations

I draw the Council's attention to the following matters and recommendations which do not affect my audit opinion but should be addressed by the body.

Accounting statement

We recommend that the Council checks the completeness, accuracy and consistency of the Accounting Statement before the annual return is approved.

Members' allowances

We recommend that the Council reviews its approach to determining members' allowances to ensure that the Council's decision to pay allowances are lawful.

There are no further matters or recommendations that I wish to draw to the Council's attention.

1. Expenditure under S137 Local Government Act 1972 and S2 Local Government Act 2000

Section 137(1) of the 1972 Act permits the Council to spend on activities for which it has no other specific powers if the Council considers that the expenditure is in the interests of, and will bring direct benefit to, the area or any part of it, or all or some of its inhabitants, providing that the benefit is commensurate with the expenditure. Section 137(3) also permits the Council to incur expenditure for certain charitable and other purposes. The maximum expenditure that can be incurred under both section 137(1) and (3) for the financial year 2021-22 was £8.41 per elector.

In 2021-22, the Council made payments totalling £ 1,000.00 under section 137. These payments are included within 'Other payments' in the Accounting Statement.


